Star Student!

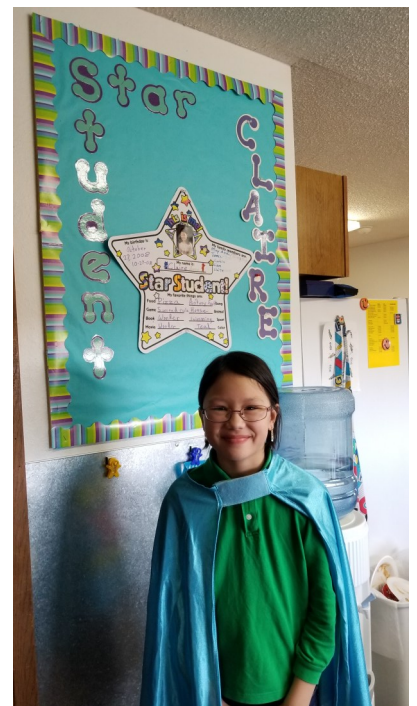
Today, I am star student! I made a poster shaped like a star, and also I'm making lunch for the school! We get a new Star Student each month. I am very, very excited!

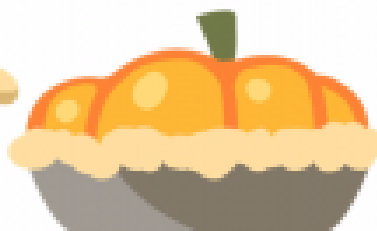
Claire my favorite thing over break was eating at the grand buffet after Thanksgiving. I also liked spending time with family and friends.
