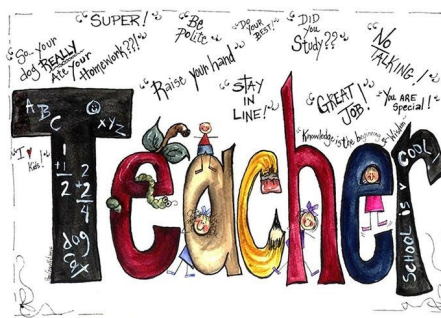
# New 'Kids' on the Block

We are also going to be recycling aluminum, cardboard, paper and plastic with the

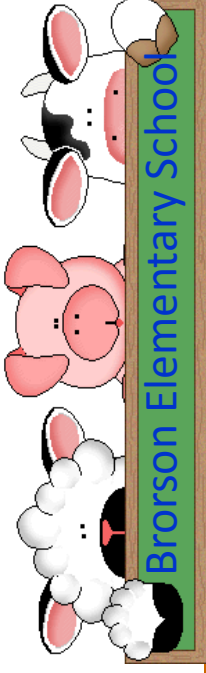
